## 2.14 Significant Activities and contributions made by IQAC

1. The College campus is now connected with wi fi.
2. 10 CCTV cameras are installed in the college campus for the vigilance over the students, teachers and supporting staff.
3. The college applied for the 'Best College award' on the occasion of SPPU University Foundation Day.
4. IQAC organized two National level seminars, 2 State level and 5 regional level seminars in the year 2014-15.
5. IQAC encouraged teachers to publish research work, to undertake the research projects and to present the research papers in the National and international conferences. As a result, 15 teachers presented Research papers in international, 35 in National, 27 State level, 08 University level and 14 teachers have actively participated in Syllabus revision workshops.
6. Our 6 teachers are working on research projects that are funded by BCUD and UGC. The total worth of them is Rs. 8,90,000/- .
7. Total 13 teachers have registered for PhD and 2 Teachers for M Phil research work.
8. Prin. Dr A P Patil received prestigious "Nisarg Mitra Award" for tree plantation and environmental awareness from Nisarg Mitra Society, Dhule.
9. One teacher (Dr S. I. Patel) received honorary fellowship of International Society of Science and technology, Mumbai.
10. Prof N. B. Borse received second prize in Poetry recitation at Sarvajanic Wachnalaya, Nashik.
11. The College purchased various laboratory equipments of Rs. 38 lakhs under the XII plan UGC scheme.
12. The interest earned on the amount deposited by teachers will be utilized to purchase the text books for students. This year Prin. Dr. A P Patil deposited Rs. 100,000/- and Dr. S I Patel deposited Rs. 25000/- for the purpose
13. The college maintained tree plantation by drip irrigation.

### 6.3.6 Human Resource Management

There is continuous correspondence and communication between the MVP Samaj management and the Principal about institutional activities. Through the minutes of the meetings of the Local Managing Committee, the students' Council, the staff, the Alumni, the Parents, the faculty, etc. information is made available to the Management. The Management and the Principal also use suggestions given through complaint boxes, feedback forms by the students and the personal contacts with stakeholders to gather adequate information to review the institutional activities. The vice principals, the heads of the departments, the staff secretaries, the student council secretary and members have direct access to the Principal to inform him about institutional activities. The Principal has a very good rapport with students, faculty, other staff, management and all the stakeholders.

### 6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

The post of the faculty and the other staff created due to the retirement or transfer or increase in the workload are filled by the established strategies and implementation plans. The vacant posts in college are informed to the central office of the MVP Samaj management which gives advertisements for the total vacant posts of the teachers and the administrative staff separately. The advertisements are approved by the University and the Joint Director of Higher Education. The selection committees are constituted by the University of Pune. These committees consist of the Vice Chancellor's nominee, subject experts and the management's representative. These committees interview eligible candidates and select them on the basis of merit and reservation policies laid by the government. The selected candidates are recruited in various Colleges as per vacancies.

### 6.3.8 Industry Interaction / Collaboration

TATA Motors, ICICI Bank and Mahindra and Mahindra Company have taken the initiatives for training our students which would help the students for future placement.

### 6.3.9 Admission of Students

The admissions are given to the students by following rules and regulations of the University of Pune, the Govt. of Maharashtra and the UGC. The cut of percentage for admission at the entry level (FYBA/BCOM/BSC) is 35 % marks in H.S.C. (Std.XII) or its equivalent. The students obtaining 40% marks or passing in the undergraduate program are admitted to the post graduate course (M.A. Hindi). The students of FYBA are admitted as per the merit considering the availability of seats and various reservations for girls, SC, ST, NT, VJ, DT, and OBC category students. The availability of seats is more than the number for admissions of students who apply. Hence, the College does not need any merit list or entrance test for the students seeking admissions to F.Y.B.A/B.Com / B.Sc. Admissions are thus given on the first come first served basis.

The student who has passed XII (H.S.C.) Science can get admission in the First year B.Sc, B.Com.Or B.A. The student who has passed XII (H.S.C.) Commerce can get admission in the First Year B.Com or B.A. The student who has passed XII (H.S.C.) Arts can get admission in the First Year B.A. only. Any graduate can do M.A.in Hindi.
