1. The College campus is now connected with Radio frequency modular for high speed internet facilities.
2. The 4 new CCTV cameras are installed in the college campus in addition to previous 10 cameras.
3. IQAC organized one National level seminar, 2 State level and 2 regional level SWO seminars in the year 2015-16.
4. IQAC encouraged teachers to publish research work, to undertake the research projects and to present the research papers in the National and international conferences. As a result, 11 teachers presented Research papers in international, 66 in National, 39 State level, 17 University level .
5. Our 3 teachers have completed 4 research projects that are funded by BCUD and UGC. The total worth of them is Rs. 5,95,000/- .
6. Total 17 teachers have registered for PhD and 2 Teachers for M Phil research work.

7. The interest earned on the amount deposited by teachers will be utilized to purchase the text books for students. This year Prof Derange, Dr S D Pagar and Prof Smt S S Khairnar deposited Rs. 25,000/- each.
8. The college maintained tree plantation by drip irrigation.
9. The construction work of building extension is completed and the department and laboratory of Physics is shifted to the new construction.
10. The IQAC encouraged placement cell to organise the Skill India program funded by The Art of living and Barcley's
11. The College contested in Best College Award given by SPPU on the occasion of University foundation day.
