As the Savitribai Phule Pune University revised the syllabi in the academic year 2013-14, the college decided to take the feedback of the faculty after the change in the syllabi. A number of teachers from various departments had contributed in the syllabi restructuring process. Therefore, the IQAC decided to get first hand feedback from the teachers. There were 38 teachers working in grantable and non-grantable sections. The feedback was taken from all the teachers working in the college. So the sample size for the feedback was 38. The data were collected with the help of a structured questionnaire.

More than seventy nine (79) percent of the respondents opined that the syllabus were includes fundamental topics and advance aspects. Nearly ninety five (95) percent teachers stated that in syllabus proper weightage was given to each topic and curriculum is useful to secure post graduate education. Seventy six (76) percent of the respondents agreed that the curriculum help in business or self earning oriented. More than sixty percent respondents however mentioned that they had not played any role in the designing the syllabi. However more than eighty one (81) percent respondents were satisfied on the current curricula. Some of them suggested some changes and suggestions, they will be conveyed to BOS members during syllabus reframing meetings.
